to view each student as a whole learner whose learning experiences in each subject support and are supported by their experiences in their other subjects;

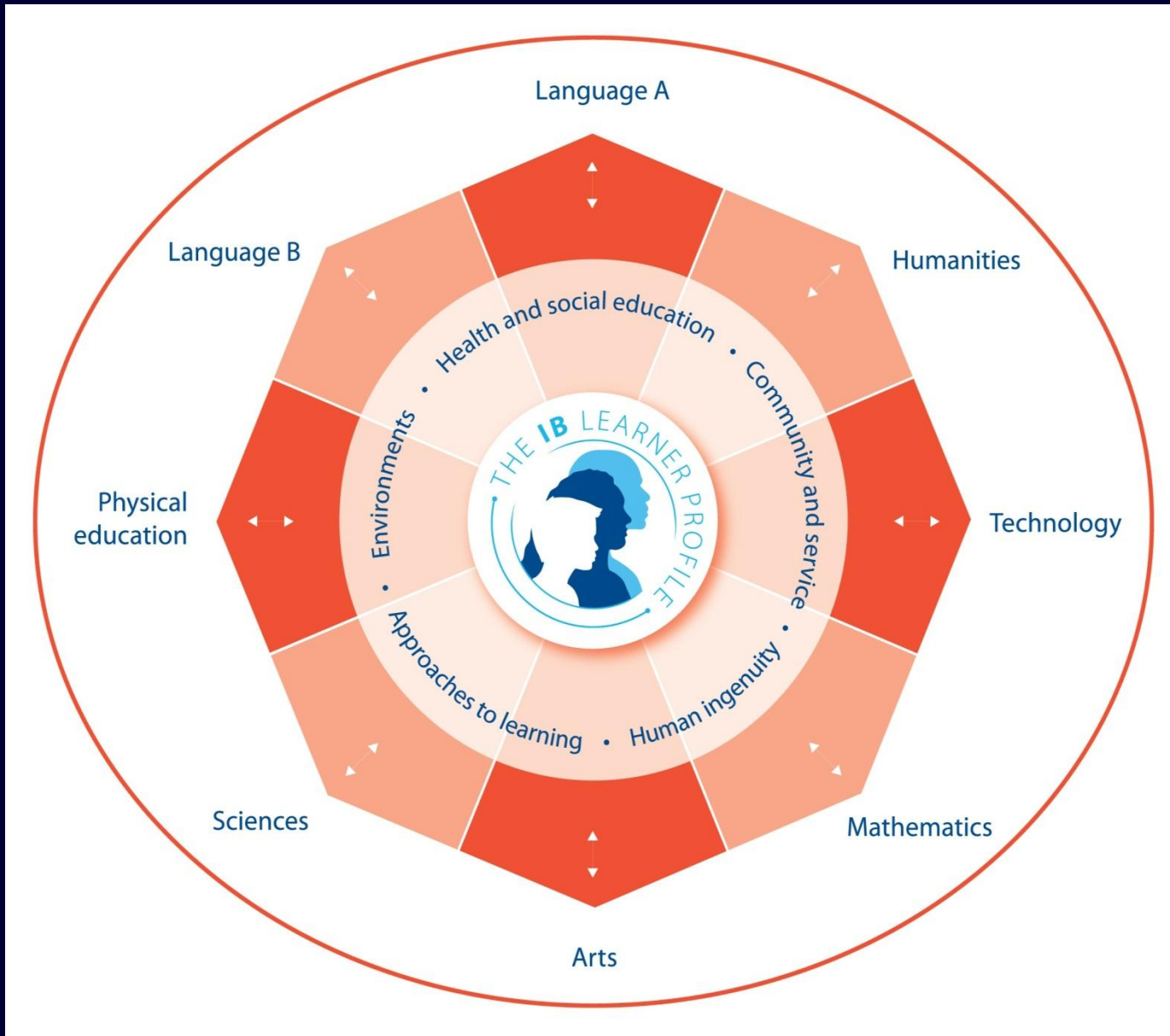
to work towards a common set of goals ...

The MYP Journey

We are moving

from an orthodox 11-16 programme	towards	something better for our students
from a community which regards education as equivalent to the provision of qualifications	towards	a learning community which believes in learning for life, i.e. learning which is sustained and valued into the future (including qualifications)
from a fragmented curriculum made up of subject courses which are not explicitly related or coordinated	towards	an integrated curriculum built around mechanisms which highlight the interrelatedness of knowledge
